## Key Considerations for students

- Understand your strengths and interests
- Keep pathways flexible - e.g. E Math is compulsory for most courses
- Start researching into the post-secondary course requirements
- Each post-secondary option will have different specific course requirements
- Speak to people (home, school \& peers)


# School Policy for Subject Combination Allocation 

## Allocation Criteria

## $\square$ MERIT

- Based on overall Sec 2 performance
- Students who perform better in overall results will have priority.
$\square$ CHOICE
- Each choice will be considered in sequence.
$\square$ VACANCY
- Allocation is possible when there is vacancy for the choice subject combination.

Note: Subject offer depends on factors like take up rate, class size and resource availability (teacher and venue).

- Students are advised not to miss this exercise without valid reasons to ensure they will have a fair opportunity in the selection process.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: What post-secondary options do students have in terms of further studies? How do I support my child?
- Q: How do we support and guide our children to choose the combination which we think is better for him/her but not reciprocated?
- All our subject combination options provide a wide range of post-secondary tertiary options for our students.
- In helping your child/ward to make the best-informed decision for their Secondary 3 Subject Combination, we strongly encourage parents to discuss with your child/ward on their interests, academic strengths as well as aspirations, and explore the possible tertiary options. It is not uncommon to hear from your child/ward that the subjects in the combination are not of their interest.
- Your child/ward may make an appointment with our school Education and Career Guidance (ECG) counsellor, Mr Low Jeng Wye, or the teachers to explore his/her possible options.

## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: By taking certain subject combinations, how does that exclude/impact them from future choices in life?
- Q: I want to know more of the subject combination if my child is interested in architecture?
- The subject combinations offered have been carefully designed to provide your child/ward with a wide range of post-secondary tertiary options.
- MOE has launched a CourseFinder at: https://www.moe.gov.sg/secondary/courses for students and parents to explore courses based on aggregate type, score, type of institute and area of interest.
- We strongly encourage parents to explore this platform with your child/ward on the tertiary options.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: How is the student assigned the best / most appropriate subjects?
- Q: Does both the Sec 1 and Sec 2 academic performance matters?
- Allocation of the above will be based on students' Sec 2 overall results and subject academic performance and aptitude, subjected to the availability of school resources.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: Is there a maximum number of students for each subject, how is the student assigned the subjects?
- Q: What will happen to the students who have selected the subject and are not accepted for the subject?
- Allocation of subject combination is based on the guiding principles of merit, choice and vacancy. Students who are not allocated what they opted for, will be allocated a subject combination according to the student's academic strengths.
- The maximum enrolment size for subject combinations vary according to the demand from students who meet the pre-requisite criteria and availability of school resources to meet the demand.
- Students will be able to submit an Appeal Form to the General Office during the appeal period to request a change to their combination, if need be. The appeals will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: How is the grading system for humanities like?
- Q: What is the difference between pure and elective subjects?
- The pure humanities will cover a broader range of content and at a greater depth compared to the electives.
- The grading and details of specific assessment demands for each subject can be found at the exams board website at http://www.seab.gov.sg .


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: How do I choose Elective subjects such as Humanities, SET, D\&T, Art or NFS subjects?
- For elective subjects, students are strongly advised NOT to have the same elective subject for all their choices. If the first choice was unsuccessful due to "no vacancy", it is likely the remaining three choices would be unsuccessful too.
- Instead, students are advised to choose subject combinations with different elective subjects.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: How many triple science students are there typically each year?
- Based on the past data, we have around 50 students who took on the triple sciences combination. As the subject allocation is by the guiding principles of merit, choice and vacancy, this number may vary from year to year.
- In addition, there are students who qualified but chose not to offer Triple Science for various reasons.
- The triple science combination offers a more rigorous, in-depth study of the pure sciences and is suited for students who are clear they wish to pursue a science-based course in the JC/Poly.
- Note: For the JC Science course, there is no need to have offered triple sciences to be able to offer 2 H 2 Science subjects.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: Is Hindi considered as one of the R5 in L1+R5 combination in final O level grading?
- Yes. Hindi may be considered as the R4, R5 subjects of L1R5 computation for JC courses.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: Is there a criteria to take higher MTL?
- The Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) is a four-year course leading to the GCE O-Level examination for HMTL in Sec 4. Students are offered the subject at Sec 1 entry level. HMTL is only offered to students who are assessed to have the ability in MTL and are able to do HMTL without affecting their performance in other subjects.
- You may contact Sec 2 Year Head, Ms Ng Poh Keow (ng_poh_keow@schools.gov.sg) for further clarifications.


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: Can my child opt for computing at $O$ levels? If not, can he take as private candidate?
- Our school does not offer the subject Computing currently.
- Your child/ward is not allowed to register for the GCE-Level examinations as a private candidate if they are currently studying in a Government/ Government-aided/ Independent/ Specialised school.
- For national exam registration matters, you may direct your queries to Sec 2 Year Head, Ms Ng Poh Keow (ng_poh_keow@schools.gov.sg).


## FAQ: Subject Choices

- Q: Will the school allow my child to drop subjects at the end of Sec 3 should he/she be unable to cope with all the subjects?
- The compulsory subjects cannot be dropped and students must take the minimum number of subjects as stipulated by the ministry.
- We strongly encourage students to choose a subject combination that enables them to balance their academic and non-academic learning as a holistic package of learning and development.
- It is more important for students to pace and enjoy their learning, rather than front load learning by maxing out the number of subjects taken at the expense of their well-being.
- For students who find themselves unable to cope with their subjects, the school will provide counselling to help them decide on the best option moving forward that is in the best interest of the child.


## FAQ: Subject Criteria

- Q: What is the minimum requirements for promotion to Sec 3 level?
- This information can also be found in the e-Student Guidebook.
- You may contact Sec 2 Year Head, Ms Ng Poh Keow (ng_poh_keow@schools.gov.sg) for further clarifications.


## FAQ: Subject Criteria

- Q: Is POA offered at G2 level? If Yes, what are the subjects that the students have to pass so that they can offer POA?
- Yes. Based on the subject nature of POA, we will consider the academic performance of the subjects Mathematics and English Language for the student so that they are able to cope with the rigour of the subject.


## FAQ: Subject Criteria

- Q: Can a student take MTLB?
- Students who obtain E8 or below for the overall Sec 2 results may opt to take MTL 'B'.
- Depending on the class size, students may need to travel to another school for MTLB lessons.
- Student can check with their MTL subject teacher for more details.


## FAQ: Subject Criteria

- Q: To be offered a particular subject combination, are there specific requirements the students must meet?
- Yes. Please refer to the slides shared on the specific criteria for the respective combinations and levels.


## FAQ: Subject Criteria

- Q: How to decide whether the student should take 7 or 8 subjects? Will it shortchange my child in future?
- Students are advised to take into consideration their total curriculum workload (including cocurricular areas and external academic areas e.g. third languages) in upper secondary levels for their selection of 7 or 8 subjects.
- We strongly encourage students to choose a subject combination that enables them to balance their academic and non-academic learning as a holistic package of learning and development.
- It is more important for students to pace and enjoy their learning, rather than front load learning by maxing out the number of subjects taken at the expense of their well-being.
- Regardless of 7 or 8 subjects, the subject combinations offered have been carefully designed to provide your child with a wide range of post-secondary tertiary options.


## FAQ: Exercise Procedure

- Q: Will sec 2 form classes be reshuffled for sec 3, 4? Based on subj combi?
- The structure for the upper secondary form classes will be tied to the subject combinations.


## FAQ: Exercise Procedure

- Q: My child is taking mostly G2 subjects and is keen to continue with three G3 subjects (Maths, Eng \& Chinese). May I know how to select the subject combination in her case?
- Your child/ward will submit the form - "For students taking predominantly G2 subjects" to indicate the choices.
- There will be a separate engagement for students who are eligible to be offered out of stream subjects (OOS) if he/she meets the requirements based on the overall assessment results.
- Please note that OOS are subjected to vacancies and the critical number of students met per subject.


## FAQ: Exercise Procedure

- Q: When will the subject combination result be shared for the selection the student made?
- Refer to the slides on the details of the timeline and important dates.
- Students will be informed of all results via their school's email accounts.
- Students will need to check the results and do not assume they will be allocated their first choice.


## FAQ: Exercise Procedure

- Q: What happens if a student misses the cut off for a combination? can appeal?
- Q: Does the school allow appeal if a student would still like to get their 1 st choice?
- The appeal period is from 8 Nov, 12 pm noon to 10 Nov, 12 pm noon.
- Students will be able to submit an Appeal Form to the General Office during the appeal period to change their combination, if need be.
- The appeals will be subjected to availability.
- No future appeal is allowed after the appeal period.
